

Rev 7:1 After this I saw four angels standing at the four corners of the earth

Each direction of the compass



Isa 11:12 Judah was gathered [after captivity] from the four corners of earth.

Rev 20:8 Gog & Magog would be gathered for war from the four corners of the earth.

Rev 7:1 After this I saw four angels ... holding back the Four Winds of the Earth

Matt 24:31 "He will send forth His angels with a great trumpet & they will gather together His elect *from the four winds*.

Ezek 37:9 "Come from the four winds, O breath, and breathe on these slain."

Jer 49:36 "I shall bring upon Elam the four winds from the four ends of heaven."

Dan 7:2 "My vision by night & behold, the four winds of heaven were stirring up the great sea."

Rev 7:1 Holding back <u>the four winds</u> of the earth, so that no wind would blow on the earth or on the sea or on any tree...

Four winds: The storm winds are brewing

Hos 8:5, 7 Samaria... sows the wind and they reap the whirlwind.

Rev 7:2 "And I saw another angel ascending from the rising of the sun.."

"Having the <u>Seal</u>
of the living God;
and he cried out
with a loud voice
to the four angels."



Sealing will identy the faithful so they are not hurt by God's Storm Winds! 7:3

Rev 7:3 Do not harm the earth or the sea or the trees until we have *sealed* the bond-servants of our God on their foreheads."

Ezk 9:4 Faithful had a mark put on their forehead to mark them too.

The mark on the faithful is the name of Jesus.

(Rev 14:1)

(2 Tim 2:19)

Sinners get a Different Mark (Rev 13:16)

Rev 7:4 I heard the number of those who were sealed, 144,000.

John here Sees the Faithful on Earth:

- 1. On Earth for the 144,000 (7:1). Contrast the great persecuted multitude was in Heaven. (7:6).
- 2. 144,000: (7:4) exactly 12,000 times 12. Unusual.
- 3. Every tribe of Israel: 12K from each; regardless of tribe size or if tribe existed in NT (7:4; see Jas 1:1).
- 4. Sealed: (7:3-4) Ownership shown on forehead.
- 5. Redeemed: (14:1,3; 5:9-10) with blood of lamb.
- 6. Pure & obedient: undefiled & follow (Rev 14:4-5)
- 7. First fruits: first converted (Rev 14:4; Rom 16:5)

Rev 7:4 One hundred and forty-four thousand

This Shows God's Protection—but of whom?

- 1. Special Ruling Class in Heaven? say the JW's.
- 2. Spirit Messenger Elijahs? say the Mystic cults.
- 3. Saved Jews in OT before Jesus? Art Ogden.
- 4. The divided denominations? Barnes.
- 5. Early Jews converted to Christ? Clark.
- 6. All Christians on earth now? Hailey

Number is symbolic, and so are the tribes minus "Dan." This is Spiritual Israel—
Gal 3:29; 6:16; Rom 2:29.

Rev 7:4 I heard the number of those who were *sealed*, *144,000*.



Rev 6:17 Asks: Who will be able to stand in day of God's wrath?

Rev 7:4 answers:

Every last one of

God's people

WILL STAND!

Rev 7:9 After these things I looked, and behold, a great multitude which no one could count, from every nation and all tribes and peoples & tongues.

John now sees the Faithful in Heaven v9

Every nation: Multi-National Martyrs (Rev 7:14).

"Now safe in heaven" Bible Knowledge Commentary

White robes: Pure (Rev 3:5; 3:18; 6:11)

Standing before the throne: Viewed as in Heaven. Contrast the 144,000 faithful on earth (Rev 7:4)

Rev 7:9 "Every nation & all tribes & peoples & tongues, standing before the throne & before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, and palm branches were in their hands.



Martyrs aren't broken/dejected. They're rejoicing!
They haven't been defeated, but victorious!
They join an anthem of praise (v.10-12)!

Rev 7:14 These are the ones who come out of the *great tribulation*.

Great tribulation: The Roman persecution!

Art Ogden says AD 70 Jerusalem.



Hal Lindsey says it's yet in Future.

Waves of regional Roman persecution hit Christianity 250 years from Nero in AD 64 until it was granted freedom in AD 313 by Constantine's Edict of Milan.

Rev 7:14 "Ones who come out of the great tribulation, and they have washed their

robes & made them white in the blood of the Lamb.



Rev 7:16 "They shall hunger no more, neither thirst anymore; neither shall the sun beat down on them, nor any heat."



Faithful martyrs are forever protected from famine, deprivation, discomfort or exposure.

Rev 7:17 "For the <u>Lamb</u> in the center of the throne shall be <u>their shepherd</u>, and shall guide them to springs of the water of life; and God shall wipe every tear from their eyes."

Lamb shall be their shepherd:
Ironic (John 10:10) Jesus the
Good Shepherd. There is
abundance because of
this Lamb's guidance.
