# Deacons' Qualifications

2 Timothy 3:16-17

The simple rule of thumb is... **Do they Trust him**? (1 Cor 4:2)

Are they "afraid" of him or are they "comfortable"?

Prospects may need more time to grow (Eccles 3:1). If so, he should be willingly accept it and grow.

Acts 1:23 Joseph Justus Barsabbas & Matthias—v.26 and the lot fell to *Matthias*.

(1 Tim 3:8) They must be men of DIGNITY (NAS)

NIV: "Worthy of respect" (Semnos) BGD

TLB: "Deacons must be good, steady men."



Is he dependable: or flighty, & irresponsible?
Must not be a baby: handled with kid gloves!
Will he "get the job done" or make a mess?
Respect must be earned— (Phil 2:25-30). Epaph

(1 Tim 3:8) Not double - tongued: (Di -logous)

Thayer: Not double-tongued "saying one thing with one person, another with another (with intent to deceive):



MSSG: "Not deceitful", CEB: "Not liars".

Do you *trust* what he says?

Is he a *whisperer* (Prov 26:22)? Or is he trustworthy & conceals a matter? (Prv 11:13)

1 Tim 3:8 Not addicted to much WINE

Addicted: (Prosechontas) "giving attention to."

Much wine: Drinkers rarely think they have a problem. Like smokers, they can quit anytime they choose—but they don't choose to.

A deacon has a servant's heart, and to him church means more than does his selfish attitude (1 Cor 10:32-33; cf. 1 Tim 5:8)

(1 Tim 3:8) Nor fond of SORDID GAIN


**NIV**: "Not pursuing dishonest gain."

**AMP:** "Not craving wealth and resorting to dishonorable and dishonest methods of getting it."

(Lk 16:10) He who is unrighteous in a very little thing is unrighteous in much.

Don't elect a tightwad deacon. He's a detriment! Appoint generous, honest, wise men as deacons.

(1 Tim 3:9) "Holding the mystery of the faith in a clear conscience"



#### **Clear conscience?**

Is there a known moral conflict in their life? (2 Pet 2:14) "Never ease from sin... unstable.."

Deacons are to grow like weeds, not be weeds!

(1 Tim 3:10) Also first be

tested: "To test as

metals" Robertson

### Are already known men?

Choose exclamation points! Not question marks?

Don't appoint one to keep him from moving.

Are they willing to do anything elders ask?

(2 Cor 8:22) "Sent our brother, whom we have often tested and found diligent in many things."

(1 Tim3:10) "Beyond reproach"
No known yet uncorrected sin.



No one is flawless. (Eccles 7:20; Jas 3:2; 1 Jn 1:8)
But is he still bound up in sin? (Acts 8:22-23)
If there was sin—why did you correct them
before now? (Mt 8:15-17)

(1 Tim 3:11) Women must likewise...

A Deacon's wife has essential qualifications




#### Dignified: Respected.

- 1. Serious about her duties as a Christian?
- 2. Display prudence, sound judgment?
- 3. Does she dress appropriately? (1 Tim 2:9)
- 4. Is she a good wife a helper to her husband?
- 5. Being respected, should be true of all of us (1 Tim 2:2)

(1 Tim 3:11) Women must likewise...

Not malicious gossips: Not given to finding fault & spreading innuendos & criticisms in the church. (Vines)



She'll know confidential info & must keep it.

Does she say harmful things about others? (UBS)


Does she her tongue bring healing? (Prov 12:18)

If she' snot trusted—her husband won't be.

(1 Tim 3:11) Women must likewise...

A Deacon's wife has essential qualifications

**Temperate**: Sober minded, self-controlled, balanced in life.



Faithful in all things: A reliable, Godly person?
Is she faithful and consistent in worship?
Is she submissive in marriage? (Eph 5:22-23)
Is she diligent in her spiritual work? (Mt 25:35-36)
Would you trust her with your wallet, car, house?

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(1 Tim 3:12) Husband of one wife -
   Greek: miás gunaikós ándres
                 = 0 wives!
1. Not a bachelor
2. Not a bigamist = 2 wives!
3. Not a polygamist = many wives
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Married men have experience in problems-solving, being responsible, sacrificing, and getting along.

He may be remarried after a scriptural divorce, or widowhood. But if controversy—he can decline in the interest of church unity. (Eph 4:3)

(1 Tim 3:12) *Good managers* of their children & their own households.

This is how he'll Work! Can he *manage* family or is he a tyrant? He will be a leader at home before he is a deacon & leader at church. Does the wife think he's ready? Does he manage — finances, house, well? How he manages family is How he'll do at church

1 Tim 3:13 For those who serve well as deacons gain a good standing for themselves and also great confidence in the faith that is in Christ Jesus. **ESV**
