
Rise of Roman Catholicism



The Apostles have passed— John being the last.

John was banished to Patmos (Rev 1:9). One tradition says he returned to Ephesus & the only one of the apostles to have died naturally, ca 100AD.



Paul foretold the coming *falling way* (2 Thes 2:1-2) also called the *apostasy* (1 Tim 4:1-3).



1) Ruling bishop to be over the elders and reverenced as Jesus Christ. Encouraged Ignatius of Antioch, (Epistle to Trallians 3 & 13) c 105AD

Clement of Alexandria c 200AD, Cyprian of Carthage. c 259AD, Apostolic Constitutions c 390AD.

2) Clergy – Laymen <u>Distinction</u> mentioned by Clement of Alexandria

(Miscellanies 3.12; 90.1) c 200AD

and, Apostolic Constitutions c 390AD.



3) Infant <u>baptism now advocated</u>
Encouraged by <u>Iraneaus</u>, c 185 AD
(<u>Against Heresies</u>, Bk 2, Chp 22. 4)

Hippolytus of Rome c 215 AD,
Origin of Alexandria, 244 AD;
Cyprian of Carthage, c 253 AD.
John Chrysostom, 388 AD
Apostolic Constitutions, 390 AD
Council at Carthage, 418 AD LAW!

Now according to the decrees of the Bishops at the Council of Carthage 418AD, if you deny infant baptism or original sin—you ARE ANATHEMA!

4) Sprinkling / Pouring Substitutes for Baptism

Cyprian: 250AD. "We think the divine benefits can in no way be mutilated or weakened.. Nor ought anyone to be troubled when the sick to be sprinkled or poured persons seem when it appears that the upon... sprinkling of the water holds equally with the washing of salvation."

(Epistle 69)






5. <u>Holy Water Baptism</u>: Cyprian 250 AD; "Sacred Scripture warns: Keep you from the <u>strange water</u>, and drink not from a fountain of strange water."

But found only in **LXX** [Prov 9:18] and deals with Prostitution!

"It is <u>required</u>, then, that the water should first be <u>cleansed and sanctified by the priest</u>, that it may wash away by its baptism the sins of the man who is baptized; <u>because the Lord says by Ezekiel</u> the prophet" (Ezek 36:25-26) <u>Epistle 69; chp1</u>.



6. <u>HOLY WATER</u>; Apostolic Constitutions 390 AD: "Let the <u>bishop</u> bless the water, or the oil. But if he be not there, let the <u>presbyter</u> bless it."

Say thus: "O Lord... sanctify this water & this oil through Thy Christ.. and grant them a power to restore health..

"to drive away diseases, to banish demons, & to disperse all snares through Christ our hope, with whom glory, honor, and worship be to Thee, and to the Holy Ghost, forever. Amen." (Sec. IV, XXIX)

Did Apostles use Holy Water (2 Tim 3:16-17)?

7. Rise of Church Councils; First Council of Nicea 325 AD.

Emperor Constantine invited 1,800 Bishops.

Held in Nicea of Bythinia. (NW Turkey)

Attempt to unity belief World -Wide as determined by 300* attending Bishops!

Resolve Arian Controversy: Was Jesus Created?

Not a parallel w/ Jerusalem Acts 15:6, 28

Develop first part of Nicaean Creed. Establish uniform date for Easter. Develop early cannon law.

This set a Precedent!

8. Rise of National BISHOPS: oversee Nations!

Canon 6 First Council of Nicea 325 AD.

"Let the ANCIENT CUSTOMS in Egypt, Libya and Pentapolis prevail, that 1. the Bishop of Alexandria have jurisdiction in all these. "Since the like is customary 2. for the Bishop of Rome. 3. "Likewise"in Antioch and the other provinces, let the churches retain their privileges"

"Since custom & ancient tradition have prevailed that 4. the Bishop of Jerusalem should be honored, let him, saving its due dignity to the Metropolis, have the next place of honor." (Canon 7)

8. Rome's Bishop becomes Prominent above 4 other declining major cities.



9. Denial of a Universal Pope

Roman Patriarch Gregory the Great 590-604 AD. "Pope is a Profane Title!

"None of my predecessors has consented to bear this profane title, for when a Patriarch adopts for himself the title of 'universal' the title of Patriarch suffers discredit. No Christian, then, has the desire to adopt a title that would cause discredit to his brethren."

9. Denial of a Universal Pope, cont

Roman Patriarch Gregory the Great 590-604 AD, regarding Bishop John of Constantinople.

In a letter to the Emperor Mauricus Augustus, he says: "I confidently affirm that whoever calls himself Universal [Bishop] is..

The precursor of Antichrist".

Gergory I, Epistles Bk 7, Letter 33.

This unequivocally proves that there was NO Universal head of the church before this.

9. Denial of a Universal Pope, cont

Roman Patriarch Gregory the Great 590-604 AD.

To John, Bishop of Constantinople: "The prelates [Bishops] of this Apostolic See* [Rome's seat of authority] had the honor offered them of being called universal by the venerable Council of Chalcedon [451AD].. But yet not one of them has ever wished to be called by such a title, or seized upon this ill-advised name, lest if, in virtue of the rank of the pontiffficate, [Bishop] he took to himself the glory of singularity, [Universal] he might seem to have denied it to all his brethren." Book 5; Epistle 18. *Same is true in Antioch. Bk 5, Ep 39

10. Boniface III Claims Title Universal Pope

607AD Boniface III sought & obtained a decree from Emperor Phocas which restated that "the See of Blessed Peter the Apostle should be the head of all the Churches". This ensured that the title of "Universal Bishop" belonged exclusively to the Bishop of Rome, and effectively ended the attempt by Patriarch Cyriacus of Constantinople to establish himself as "Universal Bishop".

The Roman Bishop is now *Decreed Universal Church Head* by the Usurper Emperor Phocas.

(Mt 16:18) Peter Isn't the Church Foundation

Look at the language of the text...

Are Peter, Grk Petros; Strongs' Piece of a rock.



Upon this Rock, Grk Petra; Strongs' Mass of Rock.

(Mat 16:13) They're in district of Caesarea Philippi.

The mass of Rock is Peter's confession of Christ v.16-17


(Eph 2:20) "Church built on foundation of Apostles and prophets, Jesus.. being the chief Cornerstone.

Mt 16:19 Keys were to Open the Kingdom

Not to make random laws on doctrine & practice.

(Isa 22:22) Keys were for opening & shutting

(Acts 2:14-36) Peter opened the doors of the Kingdom by his preaching on Pentecost



(Mat 18:1, 18) The Power of Binding & Losing was given to all apostles, Spirit-inspired speech. Mt 10:20

Peter Wasn't the First Pope!

- 1. <u>Jesus</u> didn't call Peter a "Pope." (Lk 22:24-26) None rules, servant is greatest.
- 2. <u>Peter</u> didn't call Peter a "Pope."

 But an <u>Apostle</u> (1 Pet 1:1) & <u>Elder</u> (1 Pet 5:1)

- 3. <u>Paul</u> didn't call Peter a "Pope."

 "Not <u>inferior</u> to most eminent apostles"

 (2 Cor 11:5; 12:11). Any of them not just Peter!
 - 4. Peter was married. (1 Cor 9:4) Wife.. Like Cephas

Catholic Religion Isn't in Bible!

(1 Peter 4:11) Whoever speaks, let him speak, as it were, the utterances of God.

You can't find:

Popes

Monks

Cardinals

Archbishops

Monasteries

Monarchical Bishop

Sprinkling for baptism

You can't find:

Holy Water

Priestly celibacy

Mother Superior

Transubstantiation

Pray to Mary: Mediatrix*

Tradition is law (Mat 15:9)

What Should be Our Attitude?

- 1. Have a <u>loving disposition</u>. (Mat 22:39) "Love your neighbor as yourself."
- 2. Display <u>kind actions</u>. (Gal 6:10) "Let us <u>do good</u> to all men...
- 3. Check <u>facts</u>. (1 Thes 5:21) "<u>Examine</u> all things.. (Prov 14:33) "Wisdom lies in heart of the one who has understanding." I check original docs*
- 4. Go the <u>Bible</u> (2 Tim 3:16-17) "All scripture is inspired by God..." And use it rightly (2 Tim 2:15).
- 5. Answer Gently (1 Pet 3:15; 1 Cor 8:2a) Be humble
- 6. Pray and Leave the *Results to God* (1 Cor 3:6)
