### 3. Rise of *Un-Scriptural* Doctrines

**Monarchial Bishop Clergy-Laity distinction Holy Water- blessed Infant Baptism Sprinkling for baptism Veneration of Mary Praying to dead saints Veneration of relics/bones Universal Roman pope Transubstantiation Clerical Celibacy enforced Purgatory** Sale of indulgences



Helvidius, author of a pamphlet c AD 383 against the belief in the perpetual virginity of Mary. He argued that the biblical mention of "sisters" and "brothers" of the Lord constitutes solid evidence that Mary had normal marital relations with Joseph & additional children after the miraculous conception and birth of Jesus. [Mk 6:3; Mt 13:55f]

Jerome, [347-420] priest, replied in a treatise The Perpetual Virginity of Blessed Mary, that the "sisters" and "brothers" spoken of were either step-brothers, children of Joseph by a former marriage, or first cousins, children of Mary's relative Elizabeth & siblings of John the Baptist.

Vigilantius, [c AD 400], presbyter, in France & Spain; author of a treatise against a number of church practices. He argued against:

- 1. The superstitious reverence paid to the <u>remains</u> of holy men, which were carried round in the church assemblies in gold vessels to be kissed, and the prayers in which their intercession was asked.
  - 2. the <u>supposed miracles</u> performed at shrines of martyrs, perverts purpose as sign to unbelievers.
  - 3. Sending <u>alms to Jerusalem</u>, which might better have been given to the poor locally.
    - 4. The <u>unmarried</u>, <u>solitary life</u> of clerics was a cowardly forsaking of responsibility.

Jovinian c 400. Although a monk, he published a treatise against monasticism and celibacy in the priesthood & questioned the doctrine of the perpetual virginity of Mary.



<u>Siricus</u>, Bishop at Rome condemned this treatise & excommunicated him in A.D. 390. <u>Jerome</u> with his <u>Letter Against Jovinian</u>, denounced Jovinian and showed by numerous examples that chastity, virginity, and fidelity were prized among virtuous pagans as well as among Christian. [ph So What? That, proves nothing re Mary]

**Peter Waldo; France. 1200AD (1140-1218)** 

Came across a **Bible** in French Renounced transubstantiation. Advocated Priesthood believers! Advocated *local church* rule. **Image** worship is idolatry! Pray to the *dead* is useless! **Extreme unction** is unscriptural. Clergy can marry. Denied purgatory! Holy Water no better than Rainwater! Relics were simply rotten bones of whoever. The Bible is the only source for our Authority! Pope declares followers *Heretics*. Thousands killed.



### 7. John Wycliffe: England AD 1375

1378 He asserted *Christ* was head of The Church, not the Pope! He said the **Bible** is the sole authority, not the church! He opposed transubstan= tiation. Impact: priests withholding communion didn't withhold salvation from the people! He rejected purgatory, clerical celibacy, pilgrimages, indulgences & monasticism as irredeemably corrupt 1382 He made 1<sup>st</sup> English NT Bible translation from Latin available to all the people to support facts. 1383 Lay preachers spread his ideas all over England 1384 Wycliffe died! OT now available in English too. 1401 Preaching his ideas now punishable by death! Wycliffe was the Morningstar of the Reformation!

#### 8. John Huss: Prague, Czech AD 1400

He was a *priest* in Prague, Czech, 1402 (age 33). Preached in Prague's Chapel, holding 3000.

He discovered the Bible, and Wycliffe's writings.

Huss was forbidden to preach & excommunicated.

1412 City Interdict: No LS or burials if Hus preaches.

1414 Huss arrested, asked to recant his views.

1415, July 6th He was tied to the state, straw piled to his neck, Wycliffe's MS was used for kindling!

Among his dying words he proclaimed, "In 100 years, God will raise up a man whose calls for reform cannot be suppressed." He was heard to sing & recite Psalms as flames rose. He became a hero to Luther 1517, 100 years later.

#### 9. Ulrich Zwingli: Switzerland AD1500

**Swiss Pastor in Zurich.** Read Erasmus Greek New Testament. Tithes & inst music not scriptural! Bible is our sole authority. No fees for baptisms and burial Monks and nuns were allowed to marry. Images and relics were banned. 1529 Mass was eliminated in Basel. War broke out between Catholics & Protestants. Zwingli took the field as a chaplain & was killed. He believed infants could be saved without baptism. Lord's supper is a commemoration. Nothing should be held in religion that isn't proved by Bible.

#### 10. Martin Luther: Germany AD1517

Born 1483, died 1546 **Entered Monastery, Ordained 1507** Trip to Rome—shocking corruption. **Became professor of Theology 1511** Studied and taught Romans 1515-1517. He lectured on Salvation by faith (Rom 1:17) He was incensed on the sale of indulgences. Nailed 95 thesis on Cathedral door, Wittenberg. He declared that the early church had no pope. Had debates and 2 heresy trials. Luther said: Let me be refuted.. by scripture or the clearest of arguments, otherwise I cannot recant. Here I take my stand: I cannot do otherwise, so help me God. He later translated the Bible into German.
