







v.1 Greetings: James

This James: Half-brother
to Jesus (Gal 1:19).
A Church pillar (Gal 2:9).
Full brother to Joseph,
Simon & Jude + sisters.
(Mat 13:55-56)



Bondservant: [Doulos] a **slave**, literal or figurative qualified for service. Used by John, Peter, Paul, Jude.



Jas 1:1 Twelve tribes dispersed abroad: (Acts 2:9-11) 12 Tribes: Never LOST, but dispersed. Few rescued (Am 3:12). In NT are called "Men of Israel" Act 2:22

Persevering Under Trial (1:2-12)

1:2 Count it all joy, my brethren.. encounter trials

In *imperative* mode = Command.

NIV "Consider it"

My brethren:

Softens a command.

1:2 All joy: [pas Chara) cheerfulness,

Calm delight. Strongs. "As opposed

to sorrow." Thayers. Note apostles (Act 5:41)

Persevering Under Trial (1:2-12)

v.2 Joy when you encounter various TRIALS.

Difficult circumstances that test our faithfulness, loyalty, moral principles and commitment to God.

Health issues of others (Gal 4:14).

Trials by *persecution* (1 Pet 4:12).


Poverty or calamity of any kind:

Financial devastation (Job 1:13-17)

Death of loved ones (Job 1:18-19).

Loss of one's own health (Job 2:7).

Loss of *friendships* (Job 15:4-6; 17:1-2)



A Victim or Learned to Live as Victor?

1:2 Count it all joy when ..encounter various trials.

Not "If" but "When." Inevitable (2 Tim 3:12)

If people that say Christian life has no trials,
they either lie or doesn't know their Bible.

The TRIALS don't produce joy, but Knowing the result does!

James 1:3 KNOWING that the testing of your faith PRODUCES ENDURANCE.



Persevering Under Trial (1:2-12)

Sometimes we mess things up





v.2 We are not joyful because we are SUFFERING..

Paul was depressed missing Titus (2 Cor 7:6).


Jesus was in agony on Gethsemane (Luke 22:44).

Paul said "Weep w/ those who weep." (Rom 12:15)

Persevering Under Trial (1:2-12)

- 1:3 <u>Knowing</u> that... [Ginosk·ontes] "A prolonged form of a primary verb [present participle] to "know" (absolutely). Strongs
- 1:3 That the <u>Testing</u> of your faith— [Dok·i·mos].

 Kittle: "Battle-tested, reliable, trustworthy."



Notice (1 Pet 1:7) "Gold refined by fire." Purified.

The Source of Temptation (1:2–12)

"Archeologists have found the word "dokimos" on the bottom of many ancient pieces of pottery unearthed in their digs in the Middle East."

"Dokimos" meant tested and approved: the particular piece of pottery had been through the furnace without cracking and was a quality piece of pottery." Biblebreath.wordpress.com



δοκιμος

Fire wasn't to hurt the pottery but strengthen it.

Persevering Under Trial (1:2-12)

1:3 "Knowing that the testing of your faith produces Endurance." 5281 [hupomone] Used over 30X in NT. (Heb 12:1) Run race. "In the N. T. the characteristic of a man who is unswerved from his deliberate purpose & his loyalty to faith ... by even the greatest trials & sufferings." Thayer

Persevering Under Trial (1:2-12)

- 1:4 Let endurance have its <u>perfect result</u>.

 JFB: "Have its <u>full effect."</u>

 Perseverance <u>produces</u>

 Spiritual Maturity.
- 1:4 That you may be <u>Perfect</u>, entire, lack in nothing [Telios] Not flawless, but full-grown, complete.
- It is no shame to be a baby, if you were born a few months ago. But if a person has been a child of God for several years and has not grown, there is a problem.


Persevering Under Trial (1:2-12)

1:5 "But if any of you Lacks Wisdom, let him ask.."

<u>Context</u>: Wisdom in how to face your *trials*!

You can pray about any thing (Mat 7:7) "Asks.."

But <u>This Verse</u> doesn't deal with jet engines; politics, higher math or quantum physics.



What KIND of Wisdom?

"The kind of wisdom which they would need in their trials, to enable them to bear them in a proper manner."

Ps 25:9 "He leads the humble in justice, and He teaches them His way."

Persevering Under Trial (1:2-12)

1:5 "Who gives to all men a) generously b) and without reproach & c) it will be given to him." [Future, passive, indicative]

Wisdom

How does it arrive? Idea occur. Hear a sermon. Read Article. Find a passage that applies. Christian friends gives godly counsel.

Persevering Under Trial (1:2-12)

James 1:5 Let him ask of God ...who gives to all men *generously* and without reproach, and it will be given to him.

Reproach [3679 O·ne·idiz·o] without criticism.

1:6 Ask in faith without any doubting.

[diakrino] "Think that something may not be true or certain, to doubt, to be uncertain about." Louw

HOW to do this...

Live by a faith that is receptive to God's will.

Allow God to take us into uncharted territory.

Ok not knowing where this adventure will end.

Don't know how God will work out the details.

Don't know when this situation will be settled.

Don't know why God is allowing the circumstance.

And ultimately it's ok with us.

1:6 "For the one who doubts is like the surf of the sea, <u>driven and tossed</u> by the wind."

"The wave of the sea has no stability. It is at the mercy of every wind. So he that comes to God with unsettled convictions and hopes, is liable to be driven about by every new feeling that may spring up in the mind." Barnes

"At one moment, hope and faith impel him to come to God. Then the mind is at once filled with uncertainty and doubt, and the soul is <u>agitated</u> and restless as the ocean." Barnes

Persevering Under Trial (1:2-12)

1:7 "For that man ought not to expect that he will receive anything from the Lord..



v8 being a *double -minded* [dip · Suchos] 2-spirited; unstable in all his ways. wavering, uncertain." *Thayer*

"One who is wavering or inconstant, no settled principles; who is controlled by passion; influenced by popular feeling; inclined to one opinion or course of conduct, and now to another." Barnes


Persevering Under Trial (1:2-12)

James 1:9 But let the brother of *humble circumstances...*

Tapeinos: "Discouraged, lacking in hope, with the... implication of low social status." (Louw & Nida)

"Insignificant, weak, & poor."



Persevering Under Trial (1:2-12)

1:9 "Brother of low circumstances, *Glory* in *his high position*."

Adopted as sons of the Most High. (Eph 1:5)



Persevering Under Trial (1:2-12)

1:10 "And let the rich man glory in his humiliation, because like flowering grass he will pass away."

Rich are made lowly[Tapinos] by loss of rank in being equal with all Christians.

(Gal 3:28) "For you are all one in Christ Jesus." When physical riches pass, you have eternal ones.

Persevering Under Trial (1:2-12)



1:11 For the sun rises with a scorching wind, and withers the grass; and its flower falls off, and the beauty of its appearance is destroyed; so too the rich man in the midst of his pursuits will fade away.

Persevering Under Trial (1:2-12)

1:12 "Blessed is a man who perseveres under trial; for once he has been approved."

"Let No Hero Be Forgotten"
(2 Cor 8:22)
"Brother we have often

tested
[dokimazo]
& found
diligent."

"Approved" [dokimos]. Kittle: "Battle-tested, reliable, trustworthy." (1 Pet 1:7) Fire-proven.

1:12 "He will receive the crown of life"

1:12 "which the Lord has promised to those who love Him. (Mark 10:30)

"The most significant uses were the...

How To Study James (Review)

- 1. Keep a notebook: Write out your study notes.
- 2. Read it through, 5 Chapters in 1 sitting & make notes.
- 3. Read the chapter you are studying, several days ea wk.

 It takes 3 min. Try modern translations too.
- 4. Record questions each verse raises in your mind.
- 5. Look up and define unfamiliar words in the text.
- 6. Note & link key words/ repeating words in this chap.
- 7. Ask yourself— "How does this apply to me?"
- 8. Highlight passages you think are important in Bible.
