Dan 3:1 Nebuchadnezzar the king made an image of gold, the height of which was sixty cubits and its width six cubits; he set it up on the plain of Dura in the province of Babylon.

> Critics complain that an image 9x90 wouldn't have been made of <u>SOLID</u> gold . But Daniel didn't say "solid."

Some worship: positon, possessions, popularity, or pleasure!

• In Solomon's temple: the ark, mercy seat angels, altar, doors were made of acacia wood but overlaid all with gold . (1 Ki 6:21-32)

Dan 3:2 Then Nebuchadnezzar the king sent word to assemble the *satraps*, the *prefects* and the *governors*, the *counselors*, the *treasurers*, the *judges*, the *magistrates* and all the *rulers* of the provinces...

> to come to the dedication of the image that Nebuchadnezzar the king had set up.

Exactly what this image *represented* is unstated (The Empire, Nabopolassar, Bel?)

Note: empire -wide administrative heads were required to *worship it*, or be executed (v5-6)

This would include officials as *Shadrach Meshach & Abednego*. (v12)

Dan 3:5 "At the moment you hear the sound of the horn, flute, lyre, trigon... and all kinds of music, you are to fall down and worship the golden image that Nebuchadnezzar the king has set up.

Gentile *Polytheists* would find nothing distasteful in adding another god to their pantheon of gods.

The fires of social conformity still burn brightly. Pressure to accept alcohol, drugs & immorality thrivę

Dan 3:6 "But whoever does not fall down and worship shall immediately be cast into the *midst of a furnace of blazing fire*."

Burning in a furnace was used in Persia to punish those contributed to food scarcity, or who have used false weights, or who have disregarded the laws respecting taxes. Barnes

Cooks were fixed on spits, & roasted over a *gentle fire* and the bakers were cast into a *burning oven*. Pulpit re (Jer 29:22) Burning in a fiery furnace was a common punishment both among the *Assyrians and the Babylonians*.

Dan 3:8 At that time certain Chaldeans came forward & brought charges against the Jews. [Jealous Dan 6:4]

Dan 3:12 There are certain Jews [Are foreigners]

Whom you have appointed over the **administration of the province** [Elevated positions]

O King, have disregarded You [Personally insulted]

They do not serve your gods or worship the golden image which you have set up. [aliens, with alien religion & rebelliously flaunt Your clear laws].

Dan 3:13 Then Nebuchadnezzar in RAGE and anger gave orders to bring Shadrach,

Meshach and Abed-nego. Then these men were brought before the king.

v14 Nebuchadnezzar responded & said to them, "Is it true...

Wise to ask <u>first</u> (Prov 18:13, 17)

that you do not serve my gods nor worship the golden image that I set up?"

The king would see this as disloyal, anti-god, and anti-government

Dan 3:15 "Now if you are ready ... to fall down and worship the image that I have made [very well]

Dan 3:15 "If you do not worship, you shall immediately be cast into a furnace of blazing fire & what god is there who will deliver you out of my hands?"

Pagan gods were immoral, regional, could be killed and only somewhat powerful. He's shown himself more powerful by overcoming other nation's gods.

Daniel 3 The Fiery Furnace Dan 3:16 "O Nebuchadnezzar, we do not need to give you an answer concerning this matter." We don't need to make a formal defense.



v.17 "Our God whom we serve is able to deliver us from the furnace of blazing fire & He will deliver us out of your hand.."

v.18 But even if He does not ... we are not going to serve your gods nor worship the golden image that you have set up.

Make up your mind in advance— to be dedicated (1:8)

Dan 3:19 Nebuchadnezzar was filled with wrath, & his facial expression was altered toward Shadrach, Meshach & Abed-nego.

His hope for their compliance is gone.

He answered by giving orders to *heat the furnace seven times* more than it was usually heated.

That is, they should make it as hot as possible. Barnes

Dan 3:20 He commanded certain valiant warriors who were in his army to tie up Shadrach, Meshach & Abednego, in order to cast them into the furnace of blazing fire.

Dan 3:22 Because the king's command was urgent and the furnace had been made extremely hot, the *flame of the fire slew those men who carried up* Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego.

This Fire is **SO HOT** it is lethal to those **OUTSIDE!**

Dan 3:23 But these three men, Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego, *fell into the midst of the furnace* of blazing fire—*still tied up*.



No escape possible for them by ordinary means!

Dan 3:24 Then Nebuchadnezzar the king was astounded and stood up in haste..

he responded and said to his high officials, "Was it not three men we cast bound into the midst of the fire?"

They answered and said to the King ... "Certainly, O king."

v.25 Look, I see four men loosed walking about.. without harm & the 4th is like a son of the gods

"Son of the gods" represents a common Semitic expression for identifying a supernatural being. IVP Bible Background

Dan 3:26a Then Nebuchadnezzar *came near to the door* of the furnace of blazing fire.

Dan 3:26b [the king].. responded and said ..

"Shadrach, Meshach & Abed-nego, come out, you servants of the Most High God, and come here!"

Would you hurry to come right out if you could walk in midst of 1500 degree flame unhurt, in the presence of a spiritual being?

Then Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego came out of the midst of the fire.

Sometimes it takes fire to make a believers faith shine more brightly !

Dan 3:27 And the satraps, prefects, governors and royal advisers crowded around them.

They saw that the fire had not harmed their bodies, nor was a hair of their heads singed; their robes were not scorched, and there was no smell of fire on them. NIV

Daniel 3 The Fiery Furnace Dan 3:28 Then Nebuchadnezzar said, "Praise be to the God of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego, who has sent his angel and rescued his servants!" "They trusted in Him and defied the king's command and were willing to give up their lives rather than serve or worship any god except their own God."

God has Us here to <u>BE</u> different and to <u>MAKE</u> a difference! Whom will YOUR actions inspire?

Dan 3:29 *Therefore I decree* that the people of any nation or language who say anything against the God of Shadrach, Meshach, & Abednego

Dan 3:29 shall be torn limb from limb and their houses reduced to a rubbish heap, inasmuch as there is no other god who is able to deliver in this way.".

The King is <u>not</u> changing Babylonian religion. Just endorsing the God of Israel, as well.

Dan 3:30 Then the king caused Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego to prosper in the province of

This is exactly the opposite of what their enemies

wanted to see happen!

What if God prospered you physically in balance with how you prosper spiritually? (3 Jn 1:2)

Babylon.

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
