Dan 6:1-2 It seemed good to <u>Darius</u> to appoint 120 <u>sa</u>-traps over the kingdom, that they should be in charge of the whole kingdom.

Sa-trap was a provincial governor with Absolute civil authority— with his own court! Sa-trap speaking with advisors




To unsure his loyalty, other officials worked along side him: *CFO* to collect taxes; *Secretary* to handle all official letters & a *Commander* of armed forces. Above officials answered directly to the KING ! Plus, *Inspectors* as *eyes of the king* could appear anytime.

Dan 6:2 and over them three commissioners (of whom Daniel was one), that these sa-traps might be accountable to them, and that

the king might not suffer loss.

<u>Every empire</u> had Tax collectors, B.L.M. & Port Commissioners: the Egyptian, Assyrian, Babylonian, Medo-Persian, Greek & Roman.

Later civilizations do the same: British & American.



Dan 6:3 *Then this Daniel began distinguishing himself* among the commissioners and sa-traps because he possessed an extraordinary spirit, and the king planned to appoint him over the entire kingdom.




Becoming distinguished ought to be true of *Christians* also. (Col. 3:23)

Be a great office worker, song-leader, deacon, manager, mom, dad, student, athlete, or friend--all to God's honor!

Yet know, that people may display envy as a result of it.

Dan 6:4 Then the commissioners and sa-traps began trying to find a ground of accusation against Daniel in regard to government affairs..


but they could find no ground of accusation ... inasmuch as he was faithful, & *no negligence or corruption was to be found in him*.



What a endorsement, and that by enemies!

Display diligence & ethics in our life, our jobs, family, honesty & morality! May we live in honor as Daniel.

Dan 6:5 Then these men said, "We shall not find any ground of accusation against this Daniel *unless we find it against him with regard* to the law of his God."



v.7-9 The conspiracy against Daniel had to be related to his religion!

Plutarch (100 AD) said: "Persians worshipped their kings among their gods." <u>Prophecy of Daniel;</u> Young, p.134


Daniel 6 The Lions' Den Dan 6:6 Then these commissioners and satraps came by agreement to the king and spoke to him as follows: "King Darius, live forever!



Dan 6:7a All the commissioners of the kingdom, the prefects and the satraps, the high officials & the governors have consulted together that the king should establish a statute & enforce an injunction...

Their statement may be partially true, but perhaps not totally true. Daniel wouldn't have agreed !

6:7b "That anyone who makes a petition to any god or man besides you, O king, for thirty days, shall be cast into the lions' den."



How would the enemies "Sell" this bill of goods?

It brings more *prestige* to the king !

It roots out the rebellious in the nation.

It makes the present officials look more *loyal*. [Shhhh] it gets rid of that 'goody-two shoes' Daniel.

Dan 6:10 Now when Daniel KNEW that the document was signed, he entered his house..

(In his roof chamber he had windows open toward Jerusalem); & he continued kneeling on his knees three times a day, praying & giving thanks before his God, as he had been doing previously.

Dan 6:11 *Then these men came by agreement* and found Daniel making petition and supplication before his God.

Patterns of life are set in our younger days.

Daniel: courageous and spiritually minded.


Saul: fearful and brooding.

<u>Death row</u>didn't stop his prayer.

Prayed toward Jerusalem. And the temple has been gone 70 yrs! Yet, he prayed toward this city. (Cf 1 Ki 8:48 -53)

Dan 6:12 Then they approached and spoke before the king *about the king's injunction*...

"*Did you not sign an injunction* that any man who makes a petition to any god or man besides you, O king, for thirty days, is to be cast into the lions' den?"




The king answered and said, "The statement is true, according to the law of the Medes and Persians, which may not be revoked."

Dan 6:13 Then they ...spoke before the king, "Daniel, who is one of the exiles from Judah, pays no attention to you, O king, or to the injunction which you signed, but keeps making his petition three times a day."



Dan 6:14 Then, as soon as the king heard this statement, he was *deeply distressed* and *set his mind on delivering Daniel*; and even until sunset he kept exerting himself to rescue him.



Law of Unintended Consequences


Dan 6:15 "Then these men came by agreement to the king and said to the king..."

"Recognize, O king, that it is a law of the Medes and Persians that no injunction or statute which the king establishes may be changed."



They had heard Darius was trying to *free Daniel* and their plot was about to go down the tube.

Dan 6:16 "Then the king gave orders, and Daniel was brought in and cast into the lions' den.



The king spoke .. to Daniel, "Your God whom you constantly serve will Himself deliver you."

Dan 6:17 And a stone was brought and laid over the mouth of the den; *and the king sealed it with his own signet ring and with the signet rings of his nobles,* so that nothing might be changed in regard to Daniel.



18 Then the king went off to his palace & spent the night fasting, & no entertainment was brought before him; and his sleep fled from him.

Dan 6:19 "Then the king arose with the dawn, at the break of day, and went in haste to the lions' den.


> 20 And when he had come near the den to Daniel, he cried out with *a troubled voice*.

Has your God, whom you constantly serve, been able to deliver you from the lions?"











v.23 Daniel taken up without injury. v.24 Enemies & families thrown in—hungry lions.
