Eph 4:31 Let all bitterness, and wrath & anger be put away from you.

Heb 12:15 See to it that no one comes short of the grace of God; that no root of bitterness springing up causes trouble.



Bitterness, is like drinking poison and waiting for the other person to die.

2 Tim 4:15 <u>Be on guard against</u> him yourself, for he <u>vigorously</u> <u>opposed</u> our teaching.

In this 2nd Roman Imprisonment, His 1<sup>st</sup> hearing, likely before a Roman magistrate rather than the emperor (See IVP)



Promised: (Mat 28:20), "I am with you always."


(Ps 27:10) "Father & mother have forsaken me but the Lord will take me up."

Dangerous situations?

2 Tim 4:18 The Lord will deliver me from every evil deed, & will bring me safely to His heavenly kingdom.

Paul knew he would be *executed* this time. (2 Tim 4:6) 1. Paul was repeatedly delivered <u>FROM death</u>! (2 Cor 4:8; 11:24f; Acts 19:23f; Acts 21-28)

2. Now he would be delivered from future evil <u>BY</u> <u>death</u> !!! (Rev 14:13; Phil 1:23)



### 2 Tim 4:14-22 *Final Instructions* 2 Tim 4:20 *Erastus* remained at Corinth.



Here is a paving stone from Corinth with the name *Erastus* engraved originally filled with bronze. This states he was a Roman official. Dating before AD 50. A *teacher* & Paul's *helper* along with Timothy. (Acts 19:22)

Also city treasurer at Corinth (Rom 16:23)

2 Tim 4:20 "But *Trophimus* I left sick at *Miletus.*"

**Trusted Ephesian saint.** A messenger on 3<sup>rd</sup> journey (Acts 20:3-4) With Paul at Jerusalem riot (Acts 21:29)

Note: Miracles Not for convenience (Mark 16:20) !

### 2 Tim 4:14-22 Final Instructions 2 Tim 4:21a Make every effort to come before winter. v.22b The Lord be with your spirit. To help him overcome natural timidity (2 Tim 1:7) v.22c Grace be with you (plural, all at Ephesus)

Tradition suggests: Paul's letter perhaps sent March 1<sup>st</sup>. Timothy may have *arrived* June 1<sup>st</sup>. Paul *executed* June 15th (AD 68)
