His Character

One of Paul's most trusted and close friends.

(2 Cor 8:16-17) Earnest, and willing to serve.

(2 Cor 8:19) <u>Character</u> known & trusted by churches.

Capable, Strong person

He handled tuff things in tuff churches.

(2 Cor 12:18) Sent to <u>Corinth</u> with their troubles.

(Titus 1:5) In <u>Crete</u> to organized churches. Cretans known as (Titus 1:12) "Liars, Evil, lazy."

A stronger personality than Timothy (2 Tim 1:7-8)

So strong that Paul never cautioned churches not to scare him, as with Timothy. (2 Cor 16:10-11)











Chania is said to be one of the oldest, still inhabited cities in the world. It has been in existence for over 5000 years.

Titus: His Mission

Titus 1:5 For this reason I left you in <u>Crete</u>, that you might <u>set in order what remains</u>...

Titus 1:10-11 **Silence** deceptive Jews upsetting families.

1:12-13 Reprove Cretans for being liars, evil, lazy...

1:14 **Don't pay attention** to Jewish myths.

2:2 Tell men to be sensible, and women not to gossip.


2:3 <u>Have</u> younger women be taught to love their husbands & children.

2:9-10 <u>Urge</u> slaves to be obedient, and not to steal.

Titus: His Mission

Titus 1:5 For this reason I left you in Crete, that you might set in order what remains... and appoint elders in every city.

- 1. It is the <u>Congregation's</u> job to <u>choose</u> the men. (Acts 6:3) Not elder's job.
- 2. It is the <u>Fyangelist's</u> job to <u>appoint</u> the men. (Titus 1:5) "To set over"
- 3. Elders in <u>Every City!</u>
 (Acts 14:23) <u>Elders in</u>
 <u>every church!</u> Not one
 eldership over many
 churches! (cf 1 Pet 5:2)



Titus 1:5b And appoint elders in every city... as I directed you.

□ v.6 "<u>If any be blameless</u>."

He <u>won't be flawless</u> (Jas 3:2; Eccles 7:20) But is he above <u>chargeable sin</u> in a fair trial?

- □ v.6 Husband of <u>one wife</u>? Or does he have three?
- □ v.6 A man who has <u>believing children</u> NIV (Or are they pagans?)
- ☐ v.6 And are not open to the charge of being wild & disobedient NIV
- □ v.7 Not <u>overbearing</u> (<u>self-willed</u>). Not "<u>lord</u>" over others. (1 Pet 5:3)
- □ v.7 Nor quick-tempered. (Jas 1:19) "Quick to hear... Slow to anger."

□ v.7 Not <u>addicted to wine</u> NAS

Not "given" to wine or any other addiction.

"MAST—Alcohol Assessment Test"

□ v.7 <u>Not violent</u> (NIV); Louw "A <u>bull</u>y; a violent person."

Physically <u>aggressive</u>.



v.7 Not fond of Sordid Gain (NAS)

Greek: aischrokerdeé
"Shamefully greedy
for material gain."

"Repulsively greedy." Vines

- □ v.8 But <u>hospitable</u>, (Philoxenon)

 Fond of guests (Strongs)

 Generous to guests (Thayers)
- □ v.8 loving what is <u>good</u>? (People & things)
- ☐ v.8 Is he <u>sensible</u>, Sophron, "Balanced, safe thinking."
- □ v.8 <u>Just</u>, Dikion, *Fair, right*, observing divine laws.
- v.8 <u>Devout</u>, Hosion, <u>Holy</u>, observing every moral obligation.
- □ v.8 <u>Self-controlled</u>? Mastering, Curbing, Controlling self. Thayer

□ v.9 Holding fast the faithful word which is in accordance with the teaching, that he may be able both to exhort in sound doctrine and to refute those who contradict.



Must first be able to recognize false teachers and then correct (2 Tim 4:2-4)

(Acts 20:30) Note: False teachers to arise among the Ephesian Elders!
