

15:40 But Paul chose Silas ... a prophet 15:32

15:41 Traveling through Syria and Cilicia...



An important province of SE Asia, between the Taurus Mtns. & the Mediterranean Sea—which isolates it from its neighbors. The Encircling mtns have 2 famous passes: the Syrian & Cilician Gates.

15:41 Traveling through *Cilicia*...

Ancient Cilicia — (Modern Cukorova), near Adana







The great fertile region is heavily cultivated with fields, gardens and orchards. The intense summer heat makes it essential for farmers with sheep, cattle and goats to move their herds to other higher elevations for cool temperatures and fresh grazing.



#### **Derbe from the East**


Tiny village of Derbe is 30 mi south of Lystra.

16:1 And they came to ...(Lystra





- Lame man healed 14:10
- Paul honored here 14:13
- Paul stoned here 14:19
- Many disciples here14:20



16:1 A certain disciple was there named <u>Timothy</u>, the son of a Jewish woman who was a believer

Mom & grandmom were both believers (2 Tim 1:5; 3:14-15)

**Paul converted Timothy** on 1st journey.

(1 Tim 1:2) My true child in the faith...

(2 Tim 1:2) Timothy my beloved son..

Begotten thru the gospel (1 Cor 4:15)

16:2 Well spoken of by the brethren in Lystra & Iconium Iconium was 20 miles away

Young men-get a reputation for service & morals

16:3 Paul wanted this man to go with him and took him and <u>circumcised him</u>... for they all knew his father was a Greek.

Paul didn't circumcise his <u>Greek</u> convert Titus if it was for <u>DOCTRINE</u> (Gal 2:3, 5:2-4; Ti. 1:4) Circumcision would suggest all gentiles had to.

Paul *did* circumcise the <u>1/2 Greek</u> Timothy if it was just <u>JUDGMENT</u> (1 Cor 9:20-22) Being <u>1/2 Jewish</u>, circumcision was cultural.


Determine is a thing **Doctrine** or **Judgment**?

16:4 They were **Passing through the cities**...

Timothy had a spiritual gift bestowed on him following prophecy, perhaps in Lystra...

**Elders showed their approval of him (1 Tim 4:14)** 

Paul gave a Timothy a Spiritual gift (2 Tim 1:6)



16:4 As they were passing through the cities they were delivering <u>the</u> <u>decrees</u>. Which ones?

Holy Spirit's (Acts 15:28) Showing circumcision is NOT essential!


### The Macedonian Call (Acts 16: 6-10)

Acts 16:6 They passed through the *Phrygian* and *Galatian* region

Greece



(Gal 4:13-15) Paul got sick here. "Because of a bodily I preached the gospel to you the first time; & that which was a trial to you in my bodily condition you did not despise or loathe, but received me as an angel of God, as Jesus Christ himself..."



#### The Macedonian Call (Acts 16:6-10)

16:8 And passing by Mysia they came to <u>Troas</u>



mountains and marshes; but had (1)fine wheat, for (2) quarries and for its (3) oyster beds. The Romans, formed it into a province. Paul passed through this province on his way to the Sea Port City of Troas.



### The Macedonian Call (Acts 16: 6-10)





It was one of the major sea ports in the Aegean connecting trade routes in Asia Minor to Neapolis in Macedonia by sea lines and then to Rome by road. The city was founded in 310 BC and its original *name* was Antigonia *Troas* 

## The Macedonian Call (Acts 16:6-10)

16:9 A vision appeared to Paul in the night: A certain Macedonian...was saying "Come over

to Macedonia and help us"

16:10 And immediately "We" sought to go into Macedonia...

Who just got picked up and where?

Make a note of everywhere he is picked up and dropped off.



#### The Macedonian Call (Acts 16: 6-10)

Acts 16:11 Putting out to sea from <u>Troas</u> We ran a straight course to <u>Samothrace</u>

Agean Island –about 71 sq mi. The main town is Samothrace, "Height of Thrace" is located on the NW shore.



A largely mountainous island. Mt. Fengari rising to 5,600 ft creates a *visible landmark* for navigation.

The island lacks a good natural harbor, but ships often anchored offshore. It was a sanctuary of a Greek fertility cult with deities known as Cabiri whose help was sought during initiation rituals.

Sea Port of Philippi


Neapolis, (modern Kavala or KEY. Modern pop. about 54,000), NE Greece, in Macedonia. Situated on a neck of land between two harbors.



Leading exports: Tobacco, fish and flour.



16:12 <u>Philippi</u>, which is a leading city of the district of Macedonia, a Roman colony.





Philippi was essentially a *military colony*, composed mostly of Roman citizens transplanted here to protect & defend the interests of the mother city. They were tied to Rome by the rights of citizenship, cherished above all else.


