


Paul's 3rd Journey Begins ~ Intro (Acts 18 : 23-28)

18:23 And having spent some time there,

Paul at Antioch

NOW PAUL BEGINS 2ND JOURNEY.

18:23 He left and passed successively through the Galatian region and Phrygia, <u>strengthening all the disciples</u>.


- Paul begins to <u>retrace</u> the second Journey.
- He <u>strengthens</u> saints (18:23) & <u>collects</u> \$\$ for poor saints at Jerusalem. (1 Cor 16:1-3)
- Traveling companions are: <u>Timothy</u> (2 Cor 1:1) and <u>Titus</u> (2 Cor 8:16-17)

Paul's 3rd Journey Begins ~ Intro (Acts 18: 23-28)


18:24 Now a Jew named Apollos, an Alexandrian...

- City was founded by <u>Alexander the Great</u>.
- 2 main intersecting <u>streets</u> ea 240 feet wide
- Public grounds & palaces covered 1/3 of the city
- It had: <u>Theater</u>, <u>amphitheater</u>, <u>stadium</u>, <u>temples</u>, deep water <u>harbor</u>, <u>Univ of Science & literature</u>.
- Their *Library* was the finest in the World.

This was the world that Apollos was born into.

Paul's 3rd Journey Begins ~ Intro (Acts 18: 23-28)

18:25 <u>had been instructed in the way of the Lord;</u> and being fervent in spirit, he was speaking and <u>teaching accurately</u> the things concerning Jesus,

Who instructed him is unknown

Fervent Preacher (1 Cor 1:12)

Taught accurately (mostly)

Deity, Birth, Life, Crucifixion, Ascension

Paul's 3rd Journey Begins ~ Intro (Acts 18 : 23-28)

18:25 Being acquainted only with the <u>baptism of John</u>

John Baptist immersed for the <u>REMISSION OF SINS</u> (Mk. 1:4)

"Baptism was necessary even to make a gentile proselyte... is so frequently stated as <u>not</u> to be disputed..." (Eddersheim: Life & Times p.745, 747)

That person made confession of faith.

When *the gentile* stepped out of <u>waters of baptism</u> they were considered '<u>born anew</u>... <u>a new man</u>.' Country, home, habits, friends & relations were all changed.



Paul's 3rd Journey Begins ~ Intro (Acts 18 : 23-28)

18:26 He began to speak out boldly in the synagogue but when *Priscilla & Aquila* heard him, they took him *aside* & explained to him the way of God more accurately.

They Were left in *Ephesus* on the 2nd Journey


They heard *Apollos* in the synagogue (v.26)


The *Husband & wife* teach "the Teacher."



Harmonize that with 1 Tim 2:12

A woman shall Not teach nor exercise authority over a man





Paul Baptizes Disciples in Ephesus (Acts 19: 1-7)

19:4 Paul said, "John baptized with the baptism of repentance, {for forgiveness Mk 1:4} telling the people to believe in Him who was coming after him, that is... in Jesus."

John's Baptism

Jesus' Baptism

•Repent Mt 3:2

•Confess <u>Sins</u> Mk 1:5

Baptized & forgiven Mk 1:4

One <u>Coming</u> w/ Spirit Mt 3:11

•Baptized into John Ac 19:3

•Repent Acts 3:19

•Confess *Christ* Rom 10:9

Baptized & forgiven Ac 2:38

•King <u>Came</u> w/ Spirit Ac 2:4

Baptized into <u>Christ</u> Ro 6:3

Paul Baptizes Disciples In Ephesus (Acts 19: 1-7)

19:5 When they heard this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus.

"In the Name" (Acts 2:38; 8:16; 10:47)

- 1. WHEN should a person be <u>Re-baptized</u>?

 When something 'material' was wrong!

 (The subject, purpose, element, or action)
- 2. Were the <u>apostles</u> Re-baptized? Apparently not! They were baptized right the first time (Acts 2:41)
- 3. John's baptism <u>Ceased to be valid</u> at Pentecost.
- 4. Ask a person "<u>WHY were you baptized</u>?"

 Don't supply the answer with you asking "If that's the reason" or they'll adopt it unconsciously!

Paul Baptizes Disciples in Ephesus (Acts 19: 1-7)

19:6 And when Paul laid his hands on them the Holy Spirit came on them & they began speaking with tongues & prophesying

#1 Miracles came with the laying on of apostle's hands (Acts 8:17-18)

(2 Tim 1:6-7)
The gift of God which is in you through the laying on of my hands.




Preaching in the School of Tyrannus (Acts 19:8-10)

19:8 And he entered the synagogue & continued speaking out boldly for three months

(Acts 13:14) Antioch of Pisidia.. On the Sabbath day they went in and...

(Acts 17:1-2) *Thessalonica*.. there was a synagogue of the Jews and according to Paul's custom he went to them...

(18:4) Corinth.. He was reasoning in the Synagogue every Sabbath



(19:8) *Ephesus.*.. He *entered the synagogue* & continued speaking out boldly for three months.

Preaching in the School of Tyrannus (Acts 19:8-10)

19:9 He withdrew from them and took away the


<u>disciples</u>

Synagogue leaders would be furious! They'd see it as "synagogue splitting"

Reasoning daily in the school of Tyrannus.

- Tyrannus was likely a public teacher of philosophy or rhetoric.
- He and Paul would have occupied the room at different hours.
- Weather the room was rented or donated is—unstated.





Miracles in Ephesus (Acts 19: 11-20)

19:11-12 Extraordinary miracles by the hands of Paul, so <u>that handkerchiefs or aprons</u> were carried from his body to the sick..

Articles would be brought to Paul who would then send it back to the sick person.

Paul didn't beg for cash like modern Televangelists.



Rev? POPOFF: Now I am obeying God and Loaning you my blessed handkerchief. I use the word "loan" because I must send my faith handkerchief to another family who has a need after you use it and print your name on it.

Miracles in Ephesus (Acts 19: 11-20)

19:13-15 <u>Jewish exorcists</u>.. attempted to name over those who had the evil spirits.. saying "<u>I adjure you by Jesus whom Paul preaches</u>."

19:14 <u>Seven sons of one Sceva</u>, a Jewish chief priest, were doing this.

19:16 the man with the evil spirit, leaped on them ... & overpowered them, so that <u>they fled out of that</u> <u>house naked and wounded</u>.

Miracles in Ephesus (Acts 19: 11-20)

19:19 Many of those who practiced magic




brought their books together & began burning them in the sight of everyone; and they counted up the price of them and found it 50,000 pieces of silver.

50,000 pieces would equal a man's wage for 137 years!

This doesn't require that they all became Christians, only that they renounced deceitful occult practices.




Timothy Sent to Corinth (Acts 19 : 21-22)

19:22 Paul.. sent into <u>Macedonia</u> two of those who ministered to him, <u>Timothy</u> and Erastus

City Treasurer (Rom 16:23)

- 1 Corinthian letter written here while Paul tarries at Ephesus (1 Cor 16:7-9)
- Letter carried by <u>Timothy</u> to Corinth (1 Cor 4:17)
- Proof? Paul wasn't in Ephesus on 1st journey. He didn't tarry here on 2nd journey. And doesn't stop here on the way back on 3rd (Acts 20:16-17) ◄
