




19:9 He withdrew from them and *took away the*


Synagogue leaders would be furious ! They'd see it as "synagogue splitting"

Reasoning daily in the school of Tyrannus.

- Tyrannus was likely a public teacher of philosophy or rhetoric.
- He and Paul would have occupied the room at different hours.
- Weather the room was rented or donated is—unstated.

19:10 Reasoning daily in the school of Tyrannus This took place for 2 years So that all who lived in <u>Asia heard the word</u>.. By others (Col 1:7: 2:1)



19:11-12 Extraordinary miracles by the hands of Paul, so <u>that handkerchiefs or aprons</u> were carried from his body to the sick..

Articles would be <u>brought</u> to Paul who would then send it back to the sick person.

Paul didn't beg for cash like modern Televangelists.




<u>Rev? POPOFF</u>: Now I am obeying God and <u>Loaning</u> you my blessed handkerchief. I use the word "<u>loan</u>" because I must send my faith handkerchief to another family who has a need after you use it and print your name on it.



19:13-15 <u>Jewish exorcists</u>.. attempted to name over those who had the evil spirits.. saying "<u>I adjure you by Jesus whom Paul preaches</u>."

19:14 <u>Seven sons of one Sceva</u>, a Jewish chief priest, were doing this.



19:16 the man with the evil spirit, leaped on them ... & overpowered them, so that <u>they fled out of that</u> <u>house naked and wounded</u>.

Miracles in Ephesus (Acts 19: 11-20)

19:19 Many of those who practiced magic




brought their books together & began burning them in the sight of everyone; and they counted up the price of them and found it 50,000 pieces of silver.

50,000 pieces would equal a man's wage for 137 years!

This doesn't require that they all became Christians, only that they renounced deceitful occult practices.

Timothy Sent to Corinth (Acts 19: 21-22)

19:22 Paul.. sent into <u>Macedonia</u> two of those who ministered to him, <u>Timothy</u> and Erastus

City Treasurer (Rom 16:23)

- <u>1 Corinthian</u> letter written here while Paul tarries at Ephesus (1 Cor 16:7-9)
- Letter carried by <u>Timothy</u> to Corinth (1 Cor 4:17)
- <u>Proof</u>? Paul wasn't in Ephesus on 1st journey. He didn't tarry here on 2nd journey. And doesn't stop here on the way back on 3rd (Acts 20:16-17)

Timothy Sent to Corinth (Acts 19: 21-22)



CORINTHIAN ERASTUS INSCRIPTION: This inscription contains the name of <u>Erastus</u> (RASTVS) which was the name of a Christian official in Corinth. This stone was found in

Corinth and many <u>believe</u> that this is the man mentioned in the Bible.

The Ephesian Riot (Acts 19:23-41) 19:24-25 For a man named Demetrius, a <u>silversmith, who made silver shrines of Artemis</u>, was bringing no little business to the craftsmen



Artemis to the Greeks, <u>Diana</u> to Romans <u>Fertility goddess</u> mother goddess of "the whole earth."


Preeminent goddess of classical Greece. Her nature is contradictory: A <u>Huntress</u> who protected animals; <u>Protector of life</u> and bringer of plagues & <u>Sudden death</u>. An <u>eternal Virgin</u> – <u>mother of all living</u>.

<u>Ephesus</u> was the capitol for her worship. Her temple being right there !

The Ephesian Riot (Acts 19: 23-41)

19:27 Not only is there danger that this trade of ours fall into disrepute, <u>but also that the temple</u> <u>of the great goddess Artemis be regarded as</u> <u>worthless</u> and that she whom all of Asia and the world worship will even be dethroned from her magnificence <u>Measured 180' x 375'</u>

It was built in 550 BC
Made entirely of Marble
Largest bldg in Grk world
Destroyed in 350 BC
Then Rebuilt in 3rd c. BC
This one Paul visited.
One column remains now



The Ephesian Riot (Acts 19: 23-41)

19:29 The city was filled with the confusion, and they rushed with one accord into <u>the theater</u>, dragging along Gaius and Aristarchus, Paul's traveling companions from Macedonia.

v.29 Paul's traveling companions picked up along the way (20:4) *were seized*.

v.30-34 Riot goes on for *two hours*.

v.35-41 *Town clerk* quiets rioters. <u>God</u> *really did 1 Cor 1:9-10* This theater was built in 50 BC. Just a few years before Paul came. It held 25,000 people !



Review Cities of the 3rd Journey ~ chap 19

 Antioch (of Syria) Paul & Titus, Tim begin journey
 Galatia-- Telling churches to collect for the poor in Jeru
 Phrygia-- Strengthening all the disciples
 Ephesus-- Paul baptized 12, Teaches for 2 years; Writes 1 Corinthians, Riot occurs.
