



The Ephesian Riot (Acts 19:23-41) 19:27 Not only is there danger that this trade of ours fall into disrepute, <u>but also that the temple</u> of the great goddess Artemis be regarded as worthless and that she whom all of Asia and the world worship will even be dethroned from her magnificence

One of Ancient 7 Wonders

Made entirely of white marble

Largest bldg. in Greek world




The Ephesian Riot (Acts 19:23-41) 19:29 The city was filled with the confusion, and they rushed into <u>the theater</u>, dragging along Gaius and Aristarchus, Paul's traveling companions from Macedonia. Built in 50 BC. Held 25,000 people

v.29 Paul's traveling companions picked up along the way were seized.

v.30-34 Riot goes on for *two hours*.

v.35-41 *Town clerk* quiets rioters. God did it *2Cor 1:9f*





20:1 After the uproar had ceased...

Riot in Ephesus Acts 19— lasted hours.

Acts 20:1 When he had exhorted them & taken his leave of them, <u>he left to go to Macedonia</u>



Paul leaves Ephesus after 2 years (19:10) to encourage the many saints in *Philippi, Thessalonica & Berea*

Paul's 3rd Journey (Acts 20) Acts 20:2 When he had gone through MACEDONIA <u>those districts</u>

Here Paul wrote 2 <u>Corinthians</u> In Macedonia (20:2) on the 3rd Journey

2 <u>CORINTHIANS</u>
1-7 Encouragement to Friends
8-9 Contribution for Saints
10-13 Address to Enemies



PROVE 2 Corinthians was written from Macedonia

- 1. Wasn't written on 1st Trip– Paul wasn't near there.
- 2. Wasn't written on 2nd Trip—Paul just estab. church.
- 3. Wasn't written on 3rd Trip <u>from Troas</u>, Paul passed it, not finding Titus (2 Cor 2:12-13) & mentioned it in the letter.
- 4. Was written on 3rd Trip <u>while in Macedonia</u> (2 Cor 7:5-8) Because he mentioned getting that far & hadn't left yet.
- 5. Wasn't written on 3rd trip <u>after</u> Macedonia, (2 Cor 9:4) because Macedonians had not left home yet with Paul.

Acts 20:2-3 he <u>came to Greece</u> and there he spent three months

Romans written from Corinth Note (Acts 20:2-3)

Paul wrote

Romans here on the 3rd Journey *ROMANS*1-4 Salvation is by faith
5-11 Salvation is for all men
12-15 Practical Christian living
16 Letter of recommendation





Prove <u>Romans</u> was written from Corinth on 3rd trip.
1. Paul was in <u>Greece</u> on 3rd Trip, collecting for the poor saints in Jerusalem (Rom 15:24-26). Couldn't be 1st or 2nd.
2. Paul hadn't left <u>Corinth</u> yet because Gaius of Corinth, (1 Cor 1:14) his host sends his greeting (Rom 16:23).
3. Paul is recommending Phoebe a servant of the church in Cenchrea, which is the port of <u>Corinth</u>. (Rom 16:1).

Galatians (perhaps) written from Corinth (Acts 20:2-3)

- 5-6 Practical






Acts 20:4-5 And he was accompanied by:

- Sopater of <u>Berea</u>, the son of Pyrrhus,
- Aristarchus & Secundus of the <u>Thessalonians</u>,

- and Gaius of <u>Derbe</u>, and Timothy, (of <u>Lystra</u>)
- and Tychicus and Trophimus of <u>Asia</u>.



Acts 20:5-6 But these had gone on ahead & were waiting for us at Troas.

Acts 20:6 We sailed from Philippi after the days of Unleavened Bread, and came to them at Troas within five days; and there we stayed seven days.

Acts 20:7 On the first day of the week, when



we were gathered together to break bread, Paul began talking to them, intending to leave the next day, & he prolonged his message until midnight

Here is specified when disciples met <u>to break bread</u>. This is the <u>only verse</u> that says "when they did it."

Here is also a problem with long sermons ! (Some fall asleep) But some are *WORTH IT*.

Acts 20:9 And there was a young man named <u>Eutychus</u> sitting on the window sill, sinking into a deep sleep...



As Paul kept on talking, he was overcome by sleep and fell down from <u>the third floor</u> and was picked up <u>dead</u>.

Dr Luke– says he was "<u>DEAD</u>"



Acts 20:10 But Paul went down and fell upon him, and after embracing him, he said, " Do not be troubled, for his life is in him."

When his life was declared in him—was after the apostle embraced him. cf (Elijah 1 Ki 17:21)

11 When he had gone back up and had broken the bread and eaten, he talked with them a long while until daybreak, and then left. 12 They took away the boy alive, and were greatly comforted. Paul talked & they stayed till dawn


Acts 20:13-16 But we, going ahead to the ship, set sail for Assos, intending from there to take Paul on board; for so he had arranged it, intending himself to go by land.



Paul walks <u>20 miles</u> after preaching all night ! (The distance by boat is 40 miles)



Acts 20:17-18 From Miletus he sent to Ephesus and called to him the elders of the church. 18 And when they had come to him, he said to them...




Paul calls for the elders to come <u>30 miles</u> from Ephesus to Miletus. Perhaps because of the uncertainty of the ship's next departure.

Paul's Farewell to the Ephesian Elders

20:18-19 *Paul's sincerity* in trials > humility & tears. v.20 Taught all things profitable in public & private. v.21 Preached repentance to God & faith in Jesus v.22 Spirit says bonds & imprisonment await me. v.24 His life is not important in view of his mission. v.25 This is the last time I will see you face to face. v.28 Elders guard yourselves and all the flock v.29 After I leave wolves will come & attack flock v.30 Some of you elders will be false teachers. v.35 You must help the weak: More blessed to give. 20

Acts 20:36 When he had said these things, he *knelt down and prayed* with them all. 37 And they *began to weep aloud* & *embraced* Paul, and *repeatedly kissed* him...




Genuine love among saints

38 grieving especially over the word which he had spoken, *that they would not see his face again*

Acts 20:38 And they (Ephesian elders v.17) were accompanying him <u>to the ship</u>.

Paul heads for Jerusalem with several companions carrying large amounts of money for the Saints.

Paul is told in <u>every city</u> that bonds and prison await him. (Acts 20:22)
