Baptized 12, Write 1 Corinthians, Riot

Picked up Luke on the return

Major city on Island of Lesbos



Paul Arrested in the Temple (Acts 21:31-32)

Acts 21:31 A report came to the <u>the Roman</u> <u>Cohort</u> that all Jerusalem was in confusion.




Cohort: detachment, 600 men or less. (ISBE)

Acts 21:32 At once he took along <u>some</u> <u>soldiers</u> & <u>Centurions</u> and <u>ran down to them</u> and when they saw the commander and the soldiers, they stopped beating Paul.

Acts 21:33 Then the commander came up and ordered him to be bound with *two chains*.


34 But.. some were shouting one thing and some another, and when he <u>could not find out the facts</u> because of the uproar, he ordered him to be brought into <u>the barracks</u>. [fortress]

Acts 22:1 "Brethren and fathers..." *Psychology* (and in *HEBREW!* Acts 21:40)


You are my people & some are my seniors – shows respect

Acts 21:1 Hear my

<u>defense</u>

Against charges that he prejudiced people:

- (1) Against the <u>Jews</u>,
- (2) Moses' <u>Law</u>,
- (3) The <u>temple</u> (21:28)





Acts 22:3 I am a Jew .. I'm not against them

Was born in Cilicia – But brought up in Jerusalem Not foreigner. <u>I'm from here</u>.

Educ. by Gamaliel– He's highly respected. 5:34

One of our very best teachers.

Strictly by God's law— I'm conservative re our Law

My education is fundamental

Being zealous for God— I'm just like your are.

/ love God just like you do.



Acts 22:4 *I persecuted this Way to the death*, binding and putting both men and women into prisons...

5 as <u>the high priest and all the Council of the elders</u> <u>can testify</u>. I also received letters from them to the brethren, and started off for Damascus in order to bring even those who were there to Jerusalem as prisoners to be punished.

I opposed <u>Christianity</u> as our highest officials can testify!

I was <u>NOT</u> opposed to Jews, our Law nor our Temple!



Now what could change ME who wanted to serve God like that?

Acts 22:6 "But it happened that as I was on my way, approaching Damascus about noontime, a very bright light suddenly flashed from heaven all around me,

v.7 I fell to the ground & heard a voice saying to me, 'Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting Me?'

v 6-18 restates his conversion in Acts chapter__? Memorize v.16 "Be baptized and wash away your sins"



Acts 22:17 It happened when I returned to Jerusalem and was praying in the temple, that I fell into a trance,

After Damascus & Arabia (Gal 1:18)

22:18 I saw Him saying to me, <u>Make haste, & get</u> out of <u>Jerusalem quickly</u>, because they will not accept your testimony.

Paul there <u>15 days</u> (Gal 1:18)

22:21 And He said to me, 'Go! For I will send you far away to the Gentiles.



This was the word that drove Jews CRAZY v.22

Acts 22:22-23 They listened to him up to <u>this</u> <u>statement</u>, and then they raised their voices and said, " Away with such a fellow from the earth,

for he should not be allowed to live !"

v.23 And as they were:

- a) crying out
- b) throwing off their cloaks
- c) tossing dust into the air

Acts 22:24 The commander ordered him to be brought into the barracks, stating that he should be examined by <u>scourging so that he might find out</u> the reason why they were shouting against him.

He can't get facts from the confusing mob (21:34)

He can't get facts by Paul speaking Aramaic (21:40)

So, we'll have to **Beat the facts out of him** (22:25)

Acts 22:25 But when they stretched him out with thongs, Paul said to the centurion who was standing by, "Is it lawful for you to scourge a man who is Arguma Roman & uncondemned?"

Argument used
Acts 16:37




Acts 22:26 When the centurion heard this, he went to the commander and told him, saying, "What are you about to do? For this man is a Roman." 27 The commander came and said to him, "Tell me, are you

a Roman?" And he said, "Yes."

28 The commander answered,
"I acquired this citizenship
with a large sum of money."

And Paul said, "But I was
actually born a citizen."



Ways to gain citizenship: 1) Be born of <u>Roman Parents</u>
2) Born in a <u>Roman City</u> 3) Citizenship by <u>Purchase</u>
4) <u>Bestowed</u> for Distinguished Military Service



Acts 22:29 Therefore those who were about to examine him immediately let go of him; & the commander also was afraid when he found out that


he was a Roman, and <u>because he had</u> put him in chains.

The act of binding—usually to a <u>post</u> with intent to torture a Roman citizen, untried & uncondemned, <u>was unlawful</u>.

Cicero: (106-43 BC.) Greatest Roman orator, also politician & philosopher "It is a heinous sin to bind a Roman citizen; it is wickedness to beat him... & what shall I say to crucify him?"

(against Verres)

Acts 22:30 But on the next day, wishing to know for certain why he had been accused by the Jews, he released him & ordered the chief priests & all the council to assemble, and brought Paul down & set him before them.



- 1) Asking the Mob didn't work
- 2) Hearing Paul speak didn't work
- 3) Trying to beat it out of Paul didn't work
- 4) Maybe a hearing by supreme court will get facts
